



THE ARCHIBALD, WYNNE AND SULMAN PRIZES

The Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes are major art awards run by the Art Gallery of New South Wales.

High profile, eagerly anticipated and often controversial, the Archibald Prize for portraiture dates back 99 years: it was established in 1921 from a bequest made by JF Archibald.

The annual exhibition at the Art Gallery of New South Wales – widely referred to as 'the Archibald Prize' – is a joint show of all finalists in the Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes.

Each year, the trustees of the Art Gallery of New South Wales judge the Archibald and Wynne Prizes, and invite an artist to judge the Sulman Prize. This year's Sulman judge is contemporary artist Khadim Ali.

Previously scheduled to open in May 2020, the *Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes* exhibition was postponed due to the coronavirus pandemic. The eligibility period for works and artists was extended due to the postponement, with works completed between 3 April 2019 and 14 August 2020 eligible for the Archibald and Wynne Prize, and works completed between 3 April 2018 and 14 August 2020 eligible for the Sulman Prize.

Finalists in the *Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes 2020* will be exhibited at the Art Gallery of New South Wales from 26 September 2020 to 10 January 2021. Finalists in the Archibald Prize will then tour regionally in NSW and Queensland until 5 December 2021.

THE ARCHIBALD PRIZE

Awarded to the best portrait, 'preferentially of some man or woman distinguished in art, letters, science or politics, painted by any artist resident in Australasia', the Archibald Prize is a who's who of Australian culture, from politicians to celebrities and from sporting heroes to artists.

Prestigious and controversial, the Archibald Prize is Australia's foremost portraiture prize. The Archibald Prize awards \$100,000 prize money to the winning artist.

In its 99th year, the Archibald Prize has been held since 1921. An open competition, the Archibald Prize is judged by the trustees of the Art Gallery of New South Wales. Entries to the Archibald Prize must be completed in the past year with at least one live sitting with the subject.

Finalists are exhibited at the Art Gallery of New South Wales before embarking on a regional tour. In the early years, all entries were hung.

The Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes 2020 is proudly presented by ANZ.

THE PACKING ROOM PRIZE & ANZ PEOPLE'S CHOICE AWARD

Entries in the Archibald Prize are eligible to be considered for the Packing Room Prize valued at \$1,500 and the ANZ People's Choice award valued at \$3,500.

The Packing Room Prize was first awarded in 1991 and is chosen by the gallery staff who receive, unpack and hang the entries. However, 52 per cent of the vote goes to the head of the packing room, Brett Cuthbertson.

The ANZ People's Choice award was first awarded in 1988 and is voted for by members of the public visiting the Archibald Prize exhibition.

THE HISTORY

The Archibald Prize was established from a bequest by Jules Francois Archibald, the founding editor of *The Bulletin* magazine.

Archibald was a passionate supporter of a distinctly Australian style of nationalism, journalism and the arts. In establishing the prize his aim was to foster portraiture as well as support artists and perpetuate the memory of great Australians. JF Archibald died in 1919 at St Vincent's Hospital in Darlinghurst, with the first Archibald Prize being staged two years after his death.

According to Archibald's will – held in the Art Gallery of New South Wales archive – the Archibald Prize is to be awarded annually to the best portrait 'preferentially of some man or woman distinguished in art, letters, science or politics, painted by any artist resident in Australasia'. Portraits must have been painted in the previous year from at least one live sitting with the artist.

THE WYNNE PRIZE

The \$50,000 Wynne Prize is awarded to the best landscape painting of Australian scenery or figurative sculpture.

It was established following a bequest by Richard Wynne and was first awarded in 1897, marking the official opening of the Art Gallery of New South Wales at its present site. Finalists are displayed as part of the Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes exhibition.

The Roberts Family Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Prize

The Roberts Family Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Prize is an annual prize of \$10,000 to be awarded to an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander artist for their work entered into the Wynne Prize. The 2020 Roberts Family Prize is judged by the Trustees of the Art Gallery of New South Wales.

The Roberts Family Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Acquisition Fund

To compliment the Roberts Family Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Prize, an annual acquisition fund of \$40,000 is allocated towards Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander artworks from the Gallery's Wynne Prize. Acquisitions are approved by the Board of Trustees as part of the Gallery's acquisition process.

Watercolour Prizes

Entries in the Wynne Prize competition are also eligible to be considered for the Trustees' Watercolour Prize, value \$5000, and the John & Elizabeth Newnham Pring Memorial Prize which may be awarded to the best watercolour by a woman artist, value \$1000.

THE SULMAN PRIZE

The Sir John Sulman Prize, valued at \$40,000, is awarded for the best genre painting, subject painting or mural project by an Australian artist in oil, acrylic, watercolour or mixed media.

Established within the terms of John Sulman's bequest, the prize was first awarded in 1936. Finalists are displayed as part of the *Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes* exhibition.

Each year, the trustees of the Art Gallery of New South Wales invite a guest artist to judge the Sulman Prize. The 2020 judge is contemporary artist Khadim Ali.

A genre painting is normally a composition representing some aspect or aspects of everyday life and may feature figurative, still-life, interior or figure-in-landscape themes. In contrast, a subject painting is idealised or dramatised and typically takes its theme from history, poetry, mythology or religion. In both cases however, the style may be figurative, representative, abstract or semi-abstract. A mural is a picture fixed directly to a wall or ceiling as part of an architectural and/or decorative scheme.

YOUNG ARCHIE COMPETITION

This is the eighth year the family-friendly Young Archie competition has run alongside the Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes. The Young Archie is a celebration of young Australian talent - inviting artists between the ages of 5 and 18 to submit a portrait 'of someone who is special to them and plays a significant role in their life'.

There are four age categories in the Young Archie competition:

- 5–8 year olds
- 9–12 year olds
- 13–15 year olds
- 16–18 year olds

The Young Archie 2020 competition was judged on merit and originality by artist Marikit Santiago, Archibald Prize finalist in 2016 and Sulman Prize finalist in 2020 and 2019, and Victoria Collings, family programs manager, Art Gallery of New South Wales.

Ten finalists from each category will be exhibited at the Gallery and on the Gallery website. One winner will be chosen in each category and announced on Saturday 24 October 2020.

The four winners will each receive a cash prize of \$200 from ANZ, an art hamper, a family pass to a paid exhibition at the Gallery and an *Archibald 20* catalogue. Each of the remaining finalists receive a cash prize of \$50 from ANZ, an art pack, and an *Archibald 20* catalogue.

Twenty artworks that received an honourable mention are displayed on the Gallery website and at the SH Ervin Gallery in The Rocks alongside the Salon des Refusés.


